"Stronger together in Europe!" Statement about the ESPRAS 4th European Leadership Forum (ELF)

Upon invitation by the ESPRAS-President Professor Riccardo Giunta the 4th European Leadership Forum was held in Munich, Germany from March 24th to 25th 2023. The concept of ELF-Meetings was developed in 2020 by the ESPRAS-ExCo to provide a platform for European leaders in Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic surgery to discuss current issues and future strategies to strengthen and protect our specialist society. An important theme of the meeting was that ESPRAS, representing all plastic surgeons who are members of national societies within Europe and supporting member countries of ESPRAS provides a platform for the further development and promotion of speciality as well as together addressing regulatory, protective and strategic questions regarding relationships with colleagues in other medical specialties and the European authorities. ESPRAS ExCo will be inviting representation from all other valuable European plastic surgery associations and societies as expert delegates. The goal is to coordinate and harmonize the different European expert associations by establishing effective interorganizational communication and action. This strategy is aimed to both strengthen the individual organizations and also unify the national societies to achieve proper recognition for plastic surgery.

The concept of ESPRAS "European Education Exchange Network", (EEEN), was born from the need to simplify the training experience in the field of Plastic Surgery between different European countries.






It is targeted at Plastic Surgery Residents and 5th-6th year Medical Students and

consists of an online platform whose aim is to create a network of various European plastic surgery facilities to speed up and facilitate students' and residents' visit and exchanges throughout Europe by making applications and connections faster.

All of the institutions wishing to take part to this project will be included in the network and will be visible on the ESPRAS web site (www.espras.org).



In this way, applicants would be able to select and choose between different fields of interest such as General Plastic Surgery, Hand Surgery, Breast Surgery, Microsurgery, Head and Neck Surgery, Burns, etc. This would permit arrangements to be made *in real time* since all the institutions involved are willing to accept guests from other countries.



Length of stay could range from very short stays (a couples of days) to several weeks (for example 3-4 weeks), depending on student's/resident's interest and the facilities' resources and availability.

Facilities could include universities, hospitals, private practices/clinics, research institutes, labs; each structure could declare if any kind of accommodation, special fares or other services for the guests are offered.

This platform could greatly strengthen the network of Plastic Surgery in Europe and could help in some way to counteract the trend of other specialities to overrun the different fields of our specialization.

Achieving a common purpose between the different societies that comprise Plastic Surgery could, in this sense, make the training of our residents more specific and seriously job oriented.

Young European Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons - Ideas and Options to

further improve exchange between Plastic Surgery residents on a European level

In most European countries specialty training in Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery (PRAS) requires many years of guided practice, clinical rotations, the fulfillment of an operation catalogue and a final exam for board certification ensuing an overall high standard of education on the European continent (1). Naturally, European plastic surgery residents face similar challenges in their education, despite working in different national organizations. The aim to further harmonize European standards in PRAS-Training has resulted in various European initiatives such as the EBOPRAS exam, which have been introduced during the last decades.

Furthermore, ESPRAS strongly encourages networking and exchange of European PRAS-Trainees beyond national borders. During the European Leadership Forum (ELF) Meetings between 2020 and 2023 an overwhelming majority of respondents supported the implementation European educational programs making this high-priority initiative (2). Consequently, the ESPRAS fellowship program was born, to provide a European fellow with the opportunity "to study the art, science, and skills of plastic surgery" in another country that is a member of ESPRAS with a stipend. Additionally, representatives of the resident-generation were invited to the ELF-Meetings to contribute the opinions of PRAS-trainees. During the ELF Meeting in 2020 the young generation of plastic surgeons was represented by PLASTA (Plastic Surgery Trainee Association) UK and in 2023 by residents of the current ESPRAS president Prof. Riccardo Giunta (University Hospital of Munich) who hosted the event. During the quadrennial ESPRAS-congress in 2022 in Gaia, Portugal Dr. Marta Azevedo (from the department of Prof. Horacio Costa -Gaia Hospital Center) implemented the first "Trainees-session" of the congress, inviting resident delegees from different European countries who discussed similarities and differences respective national educational systems and possibilities on how to further advance the field of PRAS and build strong ties for the future.

During these meetings different opportunities on how to increase

networking and knowledge exchange of residents on a European level have been up to discussion. On this topic, the overall agreement was to further provide the "Trainees-Session" during official congress meetings, which yields the unique occasion for personal exchange between selected PRAS-residents. European Moreover, successful educational programs should receive further reinforcement in the future. In this regard, social media could be a useful tool to advertise the educational work of ESPRAS (e.g. the fellowship program) and to directly target the young PRAS-generation.

Finally, there is an opportunity in future of founding a Young European Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery - Society (with the proposed acronym YEPRAS) as part of the ESPRAS, to create a platform for residents on a European level, which was discussed during this year's ELFmeeting. In this context, the Young European Hand Surgeons (YEHS) who act as

Quality Indicators in Breast Reconstruction

Anna Elander, Sweden

The Plastic Surgery community need to describe European quality indicators for breast reconstructions, a subspeciality in plastic surgery, which we have developed since the 1970th.

A previously published ESPRAS study on breast reconstruction revealed that there

is lack of consistency in international practice patterns across European countries and a need for evidence-based guidelines¹. The only existing European standards include guidelines for both quality indicators of breast cancer care developped by The European Society of Breast Cancer Specialists (EUSOMA)2. EUSOMA do not state how the working groups were established. Regarding surgical specialties, four general surgeons participated in one of the groups³ and two general surgeons and a gynaecologist in the other⁴. No plastic surgeons, the only speciality with knowledge about and experience of all types of breast The reconstructions, participated. European Societies in Plastic Surgery, or any other plastic surgical society, did not participate actively in the development and

therefore the outcome regarding standards and quality indicators does not mirror the plastic surgery perspective. In the area of reconstructive surgery, the group has decided that the proportion of patients receiving immediate reconstruction at the same time as mastectomy is a quality indicator and that it should be at least 40 per cent. There is no evidence presented for the quality indicator and how the level of minimum target was established. Indeed, breast reconstruction is a procedure performed to enhance the patient's quality of life and 'cosmetic satisfaction'. However, the question of when and even if it should be performed and with which technique, in individual cases, is a complex issue and a simple frequency of immediate requestion is therefore not an adequate quality indicator

In 2020, the European Commission published the breast cancer burden in EU-27 countries with an estimated incidence of 355,457 new cases and 91,826 deaths. The lifetime risk of women to develop breast cancer increased up to 1 in 7, thus it is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in females. While breast cancer is curable in 70-80% of patients with early-stage, nonmetastatic, disease, locoregional and systemic therapy approaches, including surgery, radio- and chemotherapy often leave women physically and psychologically impaired. Thus, breast reconstruction plays a central role in holistic breast cancer therapy, increasing patients' self-esteem and quality of life by restoring the femininity that female breast cancer patients often describe as lost during treatment. While breast reconstruction revolutionized breast cancer therapy and has become an invaluable part of recovery, the field of breast reconstruction is confronted with several controversially debated topics, requiring harmonization on an

international level, with clear evidence-based guidelines urgently needed.

The ExCo of ESPRAS has now decided that quality indicators in breast reconstruction issue would be a suitable study for the ESPRAS community.

How the quality indicators are developed is a key factor to whether they will truly increase quality. Ideally they are based on clinical studies, but such evidence is rarely sufficient. Therefore the experience of experts needs to be incorporated, using а transparent methodological process and composition of experts. An established scientific method to deveolp quality indicators ist he Delphi technique⁵.

The study design was approved at the last ELF meeting in Munich, March 2023 and the meeting decided to initiate the study and a scientific steering committee was appointed. The first virtual meeting will be at July 4th to finalize the study protocol and administrative details. Delphi questionnaires will be sent electronically to participants. By use of a survey form (Google docs) sent to national experts in breast reconstruction according to the Delphi procedure the quality indicators will be generated in several stages.

To succeed we need participation from both national experts in breast reconstructions and patient organizations from all European countries. We also need some young plastic surgeons willing to take on the data treatment and of course participate as an author of the upcoming papers. Eventual candidates may send a

mail to either Emma Hansson (emma.hansson.2@gu.se) or Anna Elander (anna.elander@vgregion.se). The steering committee will then take the decision.

We hope you will all participate in this project to improve quality of breast reconstruction!

The following procedure is currently suggested for obtaining membership certificates:

- 1. The national member society provides a list of it's full active members to ESPRAS or evidence of an individual membership
- EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) has to be accepted by the individual member.
- 3. A pdf is generated with for all members of a national society and sent to the national society or alternatively an individual pdf is created when 1 and 2 is fulfilled.

ESPRAS Press Release: Patient Protection and the Value of the Certified Plastic Surgeon



On May 9th 2023 ESPRAS published its second press release (https://www.prnewswire.co.uk/newsreleases/beauty-surgeons-puttingpatients-in-jeopardy-the-europeansociety-of-plastic-reconstructive-andaesthetic-surgery-espras-calls-forspecialist-training-standard-301817235.html). The response to our last press release in April 2021 on breast Europe³ reconstruction in was overwhelming. Topic this time was patient protection in Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery in Europe. It was claimed that patients better know the training qualification of their plastic surgeon. Titles like "Aesthetic Surgeon" or "Beauty Surgeon" are largely unprotected and not properly trained persons may use them.

The press release was based on our two publications on the quality and relevance of the plastic surgery specialist¹ and the ESPRAS position paper on patient safety in Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery². It was published in the three languages English, French and German. National societies can translate the texts into their national language after consultation with the agency and use them in their country for press releases and public relations.

Over 300 (308) outlets internationally ran the press release with over 10,000 views.

Outlets from across UK, Europe (Germany, Austria, Switzerland, France and other European countries) ran the article. Again a big success in improving the public awareness in the public for the highest possible qualification of a trained Plastic Surgeon.

EBOPRAS - The European Board of Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery

EBOPRAS, which is the working group of the UEMS (Union Européenne des Médecins Spécialistes - The European Union of Medical Specialists) Section of Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery (PRAS).

EBOPRAS is a foundation under Dutch Law and financially completely independent from the UEMS section of PRAS. The delegates for EBOPRAS are normally the same as those for the UEMS Section although the rules do permit them to be different. The UEMS section of PRAS receives funding from the national plastic surgical associations. On the other hand, the income of EBOPRAS consists of the registration fees of the applicants for the exams.

Organization


The delegates of the national associations of medical specialists in the European Union and in its associated countries represented in the UEMS constitutes the general assembly of the UEMS PRAS Section and the EBOPRAS. The General Assembly meets twice a year, in spring and autumn, normally after the oral examination.

The EBOPRAS has 4 subcommittees:

Committees



Exam Committee: The exam committee organizes EBOPRAS exams. Each Plastic Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery trainee who has completed his/her fourth year in training or PRAS specialist may apply for the exam.

The EBOPRAS exam consists of 2 parts (Part 1: MCQ; Part 2: oral). Each exam is organized twice each year. The MCQ exams are computer based and held at a number of venues all over Europe. The oral exams are held live. Each candidate is evaluated in two tables where two examiners exist in each. Detailed information about the exams and dates can be found in the following link:

Education Committee: The education committee is responsible for the ETR's (the European Training Requirements), syllabus, and interaction with the UEMS about regulations in Section of PRAS.

Accreditation Committee: The accreditation committee organizes

accreditation visits to the PRAS units who apply for accreditation. During the visit, accreditation team interviews with trainees and academic staff, the Dean, the director of the hospital. The team also visits the library, research labs, wards, outpatient clinics. If the unit fulfills specific criteria a certificate is given for a 5-year period qualifying the unit to the European level in PRAS training.

Specialty Issues and Governance Committee: The Specialty Issues and Governance Committee is responsible for protecting the specialty. It deals with the fake titles and collaborate with other specialties.

The main objective of the EBOPRAS is to provide a high-level of training and qualification for board-certification within the field of plastic, reconstructive and aesthetic surgery all over Europe. The standardized continuing education ensures that board certified plastic surgeons can safely and effectively perform state of the art procedures in all subspecialties of PRAS.
